GROUNDS OF OPPOSITION (Application dated 15 <sup>th</sup> May, 2015)

The 1<sup>st</sup> respondent will oppose the application dated 27<sup>th</sup> June, 2014 on the following grounds:

1. The application has been brought under wrong provisions of the law.

- 2. The application has not been made timeously. The petition having been filed last year and directions on the hearing given early this year, it is inordinately late for the proposed interested party to make the application.
- 3. The applicant has not shown that the submissions it intends to advance will give such assistance to the court as would otherwise not have been enjoyed by the court.
- 4. The applicant has not demonstrated that it will introduce new arguments different from those advanced by the parties. In particular, the parties have addressed the court in detail on the international standards and principles and it is not necessary to join the proposed interested party for that purpose.
- 5. The issues raised in the petition and the responses thereto are principally evidentiary and not concerned with the interpretations of international standards, policies and recommendations regarding HIV/ AIDS.
- 6. The application raises a perception of bias or partisanship in the petition.
- 7. The application is bad in law and an abuse of Court process.

More grounds to be adduced at the hearing.
